This material is specially formulated to bond to thermoset EPDM rubber for corner molding, end caps and special applications requiring such adhesion to thermoset EPDM. This grade of Santoprene® TPV is shear-dependent and can be processed on conventional thermoplastics equipment for injection molding. It is polyolefin based and recyclable within the manufacturing stream.

Desiccant drying for 3 hours at  $80^{\circ}$ C ( $180^{\circ}$ F) is recommended. Santoprene® TPV has a wide temperature processing window from 175 to 230°C (350 to 450°F) and is incompatible with acetal and PVC.

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
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Specific volume-temperature (pvT)



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
