## **Processing Notes**

Desiccant drying for 3 hours at 80 °C (180 °F) is recommended. Santoprene<sup>TM</sup> TPV has a wide temperature processing window from 175 to 230 °C (350 to 450 °F) and is incompatible with acetal and PVC.


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Specific volume-temperature (pvT)



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
